## WHO'S WHO

Acclaimed for the concert and cabaret stage, Aker's solo recordings include Like It Was, Presenting Karen Akers, In a Very Unusual Way, Simply Styne, and If We Only Have Love. Akers is the recipient of the 2005 New York Nightlife Award for Outstanding Female Cabaret Vocalist in a Major Engagement and the 2009 Nightlife Legend Award.

NATALIE DOUGLAS is a two-time Bistro, Nightlife, and thirteen-time MAC Award Winner, whose international performances have taken her from concert halls to theaters to intimate clubs and everything in between. KAREN OBERLIN was able to realize her dream of performing an engagement in the most magical cabaret room on Earth, The Algonquin's Oak Room, in its final season. About that show, Rex Reed wrote in the NY Observer, "Karen Oberlin is lighting up the Algonquin's Oak Room with a show that is subtle, elegant, musically spot on, and sends you out humming. She's a keeper!" A live recording of the show received the LaMott-Friedman MAC Award. Beyond the "Gonk," Ms. Oberlin received the Mabel Mercer Foundation's Donald F. Smith Award for Excellence in Cabaret, along with NY Nightlife, Bistro, BroadwayWorld, and MAC Awards, and an Honorary Doctorate in Music Performance. Other NYC major engagements include Feinstein's 54 Below, the Café Carlyle, and Birdland, along with Carnegie Hall and Jazz at Lincoln Center. She tours the U.S. and has annual engagements in London. Ms. Oberlin cherishes her nights at the Algonquin.

STEVE ROSS has been a fixture of the cabaret community in Manhattan for over forty years. He was born "forty-five minutes from Broadway" in New Rochelle, NY, and was raised in Washington, DC with an operaloving father and a mother who played on the piano the songs of Gershwin, Porter and Irving Berlin. His first major job in New York was as a successful singer/pianist at the now famous piano bar Ted Hook's Backstage. In 1981 he re-opened the legendary Oak Room at Manhattan's famed Hotel Algonquin where he held forth, off and on, for nine years. He has appeared on Broadway in Noel Coward's PRESENT LAUGHTER and off-Broadway in his tribute to Fred Astaire entitled I WON'T DANCE. Internationally, he has performed in London, Paris, Tokyo, Sao Paulo, Rio de Janeiro, Melbourne and Sydney as well as cabarets and theatres across America and on the high seas. He's hosted programs on the BBC and American public radio and was on the lecture/performance roster at the Metropolitan Museum of Art for eight years. His last show at the sadly departed Oak Room at the Hotel Algonquin in New York City, PUTTIN' ON THE RITZ – THE SONGS OF FRED ASTAIRE, prompted Stephen Holden of the New York Times to describe Steve as "the personification of the bygone dream world that his music summons." He continues to tour, enjoys well-attended shows at Birdland Jazz Club in Manhattan and continues to coach and teach the International Songbook.

DARYL SHERMAN: 2023 Bistro Award winner Daryl Sherman is one of the rare singing pianists equally talented in jazz and cabaret. Since her early stints at Sinatra hangouts like Jilly's, Jimmy Weston's, and Eddie Condon's, there's hardly a jazz joint, supper club or hotel Daryl has missed including Lincoln Center Jazz with Wynton Marsalis, not to mention the Mabel Mercer Cabaret Convention. She's renowned for her 14-year run at the Waldorf=Astoria but her numerous stints at the Algonquin Oak Room were especially pivotal. Starting with her Arbors Jubilee CD launch with famed jazz pianist Dave McKenna and later a Richard Rodgers tribute CD (with guests Bob Dorough and Houston Person). Daryl Sherman's many recordings continue in regular rotation on *MusicChoice Cable TV*, WNYC radio and countless music streams world over. Daryl is also proud to have been the band singer in Artie Shaw's 1980s .

KT SULLIVAN starred with Steve Ross in The Irish Rep's sold-out run of LOVE, NOËL in the summer of 2019 and the production was then filmed at The Players in 2020. Currently, KT is singing and playing piano every Tuesday in the lobby of The Algonquin Hotel and has been extended through 2023. In 2012 KT was named artistic director of The Mabel Mercer Foundation, which produces the annual Cabaret Conventions at Lincoln Center. She starred in the Broadway revival of GENTLEMEN PREFER BLONDES, and headlined for almost two decades in The Oak Room of The Algonquin Hotel. One of the shows she created there, RHYME, WOMEN, AND SONG was presented on PBS' WNET 13 and her award winning Sondheim show with Jeff Harnar was filmed for PBS from the New Jersey Performing Arts Center. Besides regular appearances in such New York venues as The Laurie Beechman Theatre, Birdland, 54 Below, and Café Sabarsky, she stars annually at The Pheasantry in London, and has been showcased At Lincoln Center, Kennedy Center, Carnegie Hall, Spoleto Festival, Chichester Festival, Club Rayé in Paris, and Adelaide Festival in Australia. She guest starred on Garrison Keillor's Prairie Home Companion and was star vocalist on two tours of China with Manhattan Symphonie. She was twice named one of the Top 100 Irish Americans by Irish America Magazine and was married for 22 years to Stephen Downey, president of The New York Browning Society.
