
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




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About Urban Stages

WHO'S WHO



Trezana Beverley (Playwright, Actress) is the winner of the distinguished Tony Award for her performance on Broadway in For Colored Girls Who Have Considered Suicide When The Rainbow Is Enuf. She has since created a unique signature in the American Theater as a talented actor, director, singer, acting teacher and writer. Trezana is a graduate of New York University Tisch School for the Arts where she studied under Lloyd

Richards, Peter Kass, Omar Shapli and Kristin Linklater, as well as the great Polish director Jerzy Grotowsky. Among the highlights of her distinguished acting career are: Mother Courage, A Raisin In The Sun; Flyin' West, Peer Gynt, Macbeth, Medea, and King Lear (as a man). In film: Beloved (with Oprah Winfrey), Resurrection, Carolina Skeletons and Sister Margaret and the Saturday Night Ladies. Her music and writing skills have been displayed in her one-woman shows The Spirit Moves, Constant Star and currently Mabel Madness the dramatic story with music about the life of the famous cabaret chanteuse Mabel Mercer. Highlights of her directing credits include: Spell #7; Native Son; For Colored Girls Who Have Considered Suicide When The Rainbow Is Enuf; In The Blood, From The Mississippi Delta, Pecong, The Trojan Woman, Salome, Yellowman, The Bluest Eye; Blue Door, Mask in The Mirror – an Opera, and most recently an all-female production of Shakespeare's Othello. Trezana is currently on the guest directing drama faculty of the Juilliard School in New York City and is the founding artistic director of The Trezana Projects - a theater company that uses dance choreography to express dramatic plays. Trezana is a civic minded artist who often speaks before church and youth groups. Her work has been cited in American Theater Magazine and Towards A Poor Theater (Simon & Shuster). Among other distinguished awards are: Mademoiselle Woman of The Year, The Audelco Recognition Award and The Theater World Award. She has received two Citizen's Citations for her contribution to the American Stage as a distinguished citizen of Baltimore, Md. and has also been recognized by the New York Senate and the New York State Assembly for her artistic contributions to the community. Frances Hill (Co-Director & Founder/Artistic Director) began her theatrical career in California as an actress. Since 1983, Ms. Hill has overseen more than 600 staged readings/workshops and dozens of productions of new works for the stage, directing over 30 workshops and productions. Her favorite directing credits include: Gino Dilorio's Apostasy, Roma Greth's Our Summer Days, Jim Lehrer's Chili Queen (directed at Urban Stages and Kennedy Center), John Picardi's Seven Rabbits on a Pole and The Sweepers (directed at Urban Stages and Capital Rep), Comfort Women by Chugmi Kim (Urban Stages 2004) and 27 Rue De Fleurs. Two of her plays have been produced, Our Bench and Life Lines. Under the guidance of Ms. Hill, Playwrights' Preview Productions/URBAN STAGES have moved two plays into commercial Off-Broadway successes. Minor Demons opened the new Century Center Theater and Men on the Verge of His-Panic Breakdown won an Outer Critic's Circle Award while playing to capacity audiences at the 47th Street Theater. Urban Stages' African American Poets as Playwrights won eight Audelco Nominations and Coyote On a Fence received two Drama Desk nominations and a Pilgrim's Project Award. Eisa Davis' Bulrusher was one of three nominated for a Pulitzer Prize. 2010 production of Langston in Harlem won several drama desk nominations, a John Calloway award, several Audelco nominations including a win for best music production of the year (2010), along with several other awards.

Peter Napolitano (Co-Director, Lyricist, Mabel Madness; Director of Musical Theatre & Associate Producer, Urban Stages), is a writer, director and producer active in NY theatre and cabaret. He was lyricist of Tropicana, book and direction by the legendary George Abbott (produced Off Broadway by Musical Theatre Works); and lyricist/librettist of The Lady in Penthouse B, music by Matthew Ward (produced "Mufti Style" by the York Theatre, starring Nancy Dussault); Pinocchio of Chelsea, music by Mark Janas (MMTL staged reading at the

Snapple Theatre) and That Way, music by Barry Levitt (staged readings at Urban Stages). He is a longtime member of the prestigious BMI Lehman Engel Musical Theatre Workshop and has had his songs and special material performed by many outstanding cabaret & theatre artists. His directing credits include the early work of Charles Busch at The Performing Garage and Theatre for the New City. He has received the BMI Bistro Award (director) and four MAC Awards (director, lyricist, producer) for his recent work in virtually every major NY cabaret venue. Associated with Urban Stages for five years, he has co-produced Musical Legends, My Occasion of Sin, Character Man, five seasons of the MAC and Bistro Award-winning benefit series Winter Rhythms and has directed numerous staged readings. A guest lecturer at Manhattan School of Music, he is a graduate of the NYU School of the Arts, Experimental Theatre Wing, where he studied with Spalding Gray, Charles Ludlam and Anne Bogart. Other highlights of his varied career include working with the ground-breaking Off-Broadway Ridiculous Theatrical Co. and The Glines; contributing editor of *The Blockbuster Guide to Movies on Video* (Dell); and author of a Modern Love essay for The New York Times.

Tuffus Zimbabwe (Musical Director). is pianist, composer and educator from the Boston area. Tuffus completed his bachelors' degree at Berklee College of Music and continued his studies receiving his masters' of music degree from New York University. Mr. Zimbabwe is a keyboardist in the Saturday Night Live house band. He also in pianist and assistant musical director for Trilogy Opera Company.

Barry Levitt (Composer, "The Story Is My Song" and "Mabel Madness") has been an active, forceful, award-winning presence within the New York musical community for over three decades. On Broadway, he was the music director and arranger for Catskills On Broadway and Swinging On A Star, as well as Langston in Harlem, Little Shop Of Horrors and Taking My Turn Off-Broadway. He has been Music Director, Pianist and Arranger for numerous night club and cabaret artists such as Ben Vereen, Bernadette Peters, Faith Prince, Eartha Kitt, Nell Carter, Margaret Whiting, Rosemary Clooney, Melba Moore, Julie Budd, Julie Wilson, Connie Francis, Sergio Franchi, Jack Jones, Billy Eckstein, Marilyn Michaels, Carol Woods, BJ Crosby, Chuck Cooper and Pia Zadora.. He was Artistic Director of the famed *Lyrics and Lyricists* Series for the 92nd St. Y, orchestra leader for the now legendary Persian Room at The Plaza Hotel, and President of the Manhattan Association of Cabarets and Clubs (MAC). Mr. Levitt has composed music for many industrials and special material for theatre, jazz and cabaret artists. He is currently writing a new musical, That Way, with frequent collaborator Peter Napolitano.

Gail Cooper-Hecht (Costume Designer), has designed costumes for over 300 productions for Broadway, Off-Broadway, Regional Theaters, National and International Tours, Television (PBS, HBO, Showtime, CBS, and A&E). Recent designs are: All Female OTHELLO, In White America, Most Dangerous Man In America, Queen Esther Marrow World Tours, Three Mo Tenors (World Tour), Shanghai Gesture, Off-Broadway Massinessa by Lorey Hayes for Take Wing And Soar Productions, Savior at the Dwyer Cultural Center in Harlem, Room Service Revival at the SoHo Playhouse, Arrivals (Bank St. Theater), and the Obie award winning Yiddish Pirates of Penzance. It has been her privilege to collaborate with many renowned actors, directors and producers. Taught Costume Design at Marymount Manhattan College, is a board member of The League of Professional Theatre Women and a member of United Scenic Artists Local 829. Gail Has been nominated for 4 Audelco Awards and won The Innovative Theater Award.
